News Release of Meeting

Chairperson Danielson called the meeting to order and Commissioner Lynn read a statement of announcement about the meeting that was mailed to the appropriate media, interested persons, and posted at the Central Office and on the website in accordance with the Freedom of Information Act.

Invocation

Commissioner Barnwell gave the invocation.

Adoption of the Agenda

The Commission adopted the August 20, 2015 Meeting Agenda by unanimous consent. (Attachment A)

Approval of the Minutes of the July 16, 2015 Commission Meetings

The Commission approved the July 16, 2015 Commission Meeting minutes by unanimous consent.

Public Input

Mrs. Deborah McPherson of Columbia, SC spoke on behalf of herself, Mr. Anthony Thompson of Columbia, SC spoke on behalf of Community Options, Inc., and Mr. Gerald Bernard of Spartanburg, SC spoke on behalf of the Charles Lea Center.

Commissioners' Update

Commissioners Thompson and Lemel spoke of events in their district.

FY 2017 Potential Budget Request Items Discussion

Dr. Buscemi stated she and staff have met with the Leadership Group of Providers and the Consumer, Family and Advocate Advisory Group to start initial discussions of the FY 2017 budget requests. Additional items were added after meeting with the Leadership Group of Providers. DDSN will have follow-up meetings once stakeholders reach out to their network for inputs. She anticipates that other items will be added. Dr. Buscemi then spoke in detail of each item request with the funding associated with the items. Discussion followed. It was suggested to add, "provider based" on the Regional Crisis Stabilization item and include funding to assist providers in converting to direct billing in relation to Proviso 36.13 as an additional item. <u>Status Report on Investigation of HUD Related Room and Board Charges to Consumers</u>

Mr. Waring shared a summary of the ten provider repayment plans as submitted to DDSN as of August 18, 2015. He added that DDSN will meet with providers if requested. Dr. Buscemi stated that SIG and DDSN staff have been meeting to make sure that we did our due diligence to make sure we have answered all questions. Other issues were discovered during the re-evaluation such as duplicate costs. There will be additional reviews to explore these issues. Dr. Buscemi also stated the HAP plan is complete and the accuracy of the Burkett, Burkett and Burkett spreadsheet used during the review was validated. Mr. Waring reported that DDSN's fifty percent share of the overcharges will be paid out based on the approved repayment plans of each Board. He will keep the Commission apprised of how DDSN is reimbursing the providers.

Dr. Buscemi stated the notification to families of reimbursement needs to be individualized. Dr. Buscemi spoke of the changes being made to prevent this issue from reoccurring in the future. Changes to the directives will be made for better understanding which will include a controlled modified spreadsheet or template. She also added that oversight by DDSN will be increased.

Commissioner Lemel stated the recent meeting with Senator Hayes was very beneficial because of the direct dialogue. Commissioner Lemel invited other providers to bridge the gap and extended an open invitation to the providers to contact him on any issue.

Waiting List Progress Report

Mrs. Beck gave a detailed update of the Intellectual Disability/Related Disabilities, the Community Supports and the Head and Spinal Cord reduction waiting list reduction efforts, as well as the Critical Needs List. She also presented a Pervasive Development Disorder Program Report that included BabyNet transition data. Mrs. Beck added that the number of individuals pending has improved. Dr. Buscemi stated case management supervisors will be meeting next week regarding pre-enrollment. Discussion followed regarding bed expansion and how many beds will be afforded by the funds appropriated by the legislature. Dr. Buscemi reported that DDSN will start rolling out 100 slots per week. A memo will be sent to the provider network notifying them of this initiative and to assist them with planning for people on their caseloads. Some of the funds will go to the HASCI population. (Attachment C)

Year-end Report on DDSN Eligibility Determinations

Mrs. Beck provided a chart representing requests for DDSN eligibility and confirmed eligibility determination as well as a chart representing the number of requests for DDSN Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) eligibility. (Attachment D)

<u>Prioritization of Family/Consumer Survey Comparison of SC to National</u> Standards

Mrs. Beck spoke of the one-year contract that DDSN has with the Council of Quality Leadership to engage in personal outcomes with consumer and families. Dr. Buscemi said this subject mirrors with the strategic planning process. Discussion followed. Dr. Buscemi will have staff create a report that may be more helpful to show how South Carolina stands based on the last NCI report across the four NCI surveys in the area of satisfaction.

Commission Meeting Schedule

Commissioner Lynn made the motion to reschedule the November 19, 2015 Commission Meeting to November 12, 2015 in order for Dr. Buscemi to attend the NASDDDS Board Meeting. The motion was seconded and passed.

Commission Meeting Locations

There was discussion as to whether to have Commission meetings at other locations. Chairman Danielson authorized staff to setup meetings at other locations on a quarterly basis. It was agreed to schedule the November meeting at the Pickens County Board of Disabilities and Special Needs.

State Director's Report

Dr. Buscemi reported on the following:

A half-day Commission work session is scheduled for Wednesday, September 16, 2015 to discuss the strategic planning process.

There will be a new agenda item in October to invite providers to showcase their new employment initiatives.

SCDDHS Director, Christian Soura, will present at the September 17, 2015 Commission Meeting.

The September 17, 2015 Commission Meeting agenda will include the FY 2016 spending plan and prioritization of the FY 2017 budget request items.





DDSN Eligibility Determinations Year-end Report





Requests for DDSN eligibility determination have increased nearly 29 percent over the past six years. Two significant changes are driving this increase. Based on 2010 data, the Center for Disease Control published an increased prevalence rate of autism from 1:88 to 1:68, a 30 percent increase.

In 2013 the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, 5th Edition (DSM-5) issued new criteria for the diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). The new ASD diagnosis is broader and now encompasses what had been four separate disorders. Two of the former disorders did not meet DDSN eligibility criteria as established by state law. Over the last five years, the number of requests for eligibility under the ASD category has increased nearly 120 percent.
